## Foundations of Leadership: Early Trials

Growing up I always knew that taking on responsibilities and persevering through challenges were within my reach. This belief was put to the test when I was just 21 and in the middle of my master's program, as I faced the sudden loss of my father. The weight of my family's future—supporting a grieving mother and two younger siblings while managing our poultry farm—landed squarely on my shoulders. Despite these daunting responsibilities, I refused to let this moment of hardship derail my studies or our family business. I not only kept our operations running smoothly but also excelled academically, topping my class, earning a gold



medal, and later earning a PhD. This chapter of my life taught me the depth of my own strength and resilience, allowing me to emerge as a leader who could handle any challenge thrown my way. As I stabilized my family's situation, I was ready to face new challenges beyond the family business, continually breaking barriers in a male-dominated field and proving that my early experiences had crafted a formidable leader.

## Harvard and Harmony: Achieving Excellence and Balance

Carrying the discipline and resilience honed from my early leadership experiences into my academic career, I embarked on a new chapter of challenges and achievements when I moved to the United States in 2007. At Harvard University, I secured an exciting research position in plant evolutionary and developmental genetics even before I had defended my thesis. Under the mentorship of Dr. Elena Kramer, I delved into innovative research that not only advanced my field but also deeply satisfied my academic curiosity. This period of intense scholarly activity coincided with personal growth as I welcomed my daughter Anya in 2012. Managing the demands of a high-caliber research environment while embracing motherhood taught me the true meaning of balance and support. I remained committed to my research until my due date, and after a brief maternity leave of 11 weeks, I returned with renewed vigor, thanks to the incredible support from my advisor and lab mates. This experience reinforced a valuable lesson: with determination and the right support, the possibilities for women are boundless. My time at Harvard was not just about professional growth—it shaped me into a leader who thrives on challenge and champions the potential of disciplined pursuit.

## Advocating for Equity: Leadership in Diversity

As I transitioned into my tenure-track position in 2014, I was not just setting the tone for my academic career but also deepening my commitment to gender and racial equity. Working with a diverse student body highlighted the significant disparities in achievement that still exist in our education system. Driven by the philosophy that quality education should be accessible to everyone, I have been proactive in closing this gap, ensuring that my research team reflects a broad spectrum of backgrounds and perspectives. My dedication to fostering an inclusive academic environment led me to take on leadership roles within the STEM Women Faculty Association and later, the ACE Women's Network of Southern California. Through these platforms, I have worked diligently to help develop strategic plans and governance structures that enhance professional development opportunities for women in higher education, serving more than 800 women across Southern California. In my department, I chair the Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) committee and have been appointed as the Provost Fellow for Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (2022-2023). These roles have not only allowed me to champion DEI initiatives but also to lead from where I am, utilizing my position to influence and implement meaningful change. The last decade has reinforced a critical lesson: leadership is about using one's privilege to uplift those who are underprivileged, and with integrity and resilience, it is possible to make a significant impact.

## Strategic Impact: Transformative Leadership

This year, I have taken on the role of faculty fellow for university assessment, collaborating with all seven colleges to develop a fair and high-quality assessment system that is considerate of both faculty and student perspectives.

Tackling complex problems and devising practical solutions energizes me, as it leverages my skills in strategic leadership and my passion for making a tangible impact. Throughout these experiences, I have remained unabashedly ambitious, always striving to break not just glass ceilings but also the more

formidable concrete barriers associated with gender and racial inequities. My career reflects my belief in leading from where I am, using every position I hold to effect positive change and inspire others. As I look to the future, I am excited about the possibilities that lie ahead. I don't know exactly what my next chapter holds, but I am confident in my ability to continue making a significant impact. With a track record of resilience, compassion, and integrity, I am committed to advancing an inclusive higher education system where everyone can thrive. The journey continues, and I am eager to see where it leads, always ready to give my all and serve with the unwavering commitment to excellence that has defined my path so far.
