Dear faculty,

If you're behind on everything, you're not alone! Me too!

Here's an audacious idea for the last week of class: Don't hold "review sessions" that are more like press conferences, where students pepper you with questions and anxiously write down what you say.

Instead, give an *ungraded* quarter-length practice exam\* or culminating activity. When students are done, have them 1) write down the areas they want to focus on as they prepare for the final, based on their level of comfort or discomfort with the practice exam, and 2) map out when they plan to study over the next few days. Briefly review their performance on the practice activity so you can set up for the final day of class: Ask them to do it again – this time, focusing on the areas that most students needed practice in. This works because the person doing the talking, writing, or figuring is the person who is *learning*.

\*It's probably even okay if these are questions from your actual exam, maybe just slightly tweaked.
