 fantastic <u>classroom help site</u>! It's a one-stop shop full of videos, webpage info, and
 quickguides for the technology in your classroom. Get how-to's, descriptions of available
 technology, and see the adapters (with pictures!) your system has.
- Generative Al Series: Join CAFE and faculty experts for Zoom workshops/collegial
 conversations on learning to use Al in your classes. Topics include: <u>Basics of Al</u>, <u>Al in the
 disciplines</u>, <u>prompt engineering</u>, <u>designing courses with Al in mind</u>, and <u>designing
