Request an Instructional Design consultation and say "sprint review" in the Purpose field and "Fall 2024" in the Timeline field.

Literacy & Prompt Engineering (Oct. 15); A.I. Grading, Detection, and Policies (Oct. 22); and A.I. Assignments and Assessments (Nov. 12). Register to attend in real time or get recordings.
