# Dear faculty,

Sometimes you only have ten minutes! Going back to super basic course design strategies, here's an idea for something to do in ten minutes or less that will help your students *and* contribute to perceptions of course organization, a factor that strongly influences student evaluation results. For your next class period or meeting:

- 1. Write out a list of "what you'll learn today." These are, basically, <u>lesson-level learning</u> <u>objectives</u>.
- 2. Post the list where everyone can see it during the class. Tell students that the exam questions will mirror this list.

That's it! If you have an extra ten minutes, end the class period by giving students two minutes to look back at the list and write down which ones they felt they learned during class and which ones they still need help on. Collect the answers and decide how to proceed based on their feedback. If you have an *extra* extra ten minutes, write down an idea for an exam question for each item (this might save you time later, in fact).
