Secondly, on Thursday Oct. 31, 9:48am, Faculty Affairs sent out an email describing the student evaluation process for our courses, giving resources on how to use the online evaluation system, and mentioning policies about giving time in class for the surveys. Please read that email thoroughly! Also, here's a recording of a presentation (40m:52s, content begins at 1m:30s) from Institutional Research, Policy, & Analytics about our evaluation system.

Regarding course evaluations, most *urgently*, you can now see a link for "Course Evaluations" in your Canvas course navigation menu. Only you can see it right now – students will see it beginning November 17. By default, students have two weeks to complete evaluations. If you want to change the time frame for your course to less than two weeks, you must do it by November 10. See the <u>system navigation guide</u> for instructions.

Most *importantly*, we all want the most useful feedback from our students. That requires getting very good return rates for the surveys. Below, see the email I sent to my Fall 2023 students. My strategies worked! I had a 92% completion rate that semester.

Hello everyone,

<u>Student evaluations</u> are now open and available for you to complete! Please look at the left-hand navigation menu in our Canvas course, or go to MyCPP and log in there. I value your feedback about the class and you have my promise that it will be used. In fact, your feedback is so valuable that we'll do two special things:

- 1. Although you can do the evaluation survey any time from now to December 1, we will take time during class on November 25 for you to do them.*
- 2. I can see the completion rate for the surveys, but I cannot see results or if you completed your individual survey. If we get a 90% completion rate on the surveys, everyone will get to indicate one question of their choice on the final exam that they want to count 1.5 times as much. In other words if you think you did great on a question, that one counts extra! If you didn't do great on the question I won't take off extra, so this is a no-lose situation. But ONLY if we get to 90% completion rate! So, please contribute to the cause and to a great class for my next group of students!**

*If a course has a synchronous or face to face component, offering class time is required by Policy 1329.

**Adjust as reasonable for your course; the idea is that a small academic reward for meeting a class-level goal is helpful.
