To the world of Cal Poly Pomona, Dr. Barbara Burke is known as a professor of Chemistry, the Director of SEES or an advisor for the Chemistry Department. To SEES students and alumni, Dr. Burke is a god send. She has truly been our saving grace in every situation. Whether you need advising, information about a scholarship, information about summer internships or information about getting yourself out of trouble, she always has the answer. We would like to thank Dr. Burke for all of her guidance and time. Thank you very much Dr. Burke!

Dr. Burke has always been known to take on numerous projects at one time. This past year, she split time between projects. Dr. Burke was co-PI with Dr. Pam Sperry on the final-year "Bridges To The Doctorate" program with the University of Minnesota funded by the NIH. This grant supports summer research for Cal Poly Pomona graduate students at the University of Minnesota to increase the number of Master's students who go on to get a Ph.D. They are currently in the third year of this three-year grant.

Dr. Burke's second project was continuing as faculty coordinator of the mentoring program supported by the Howard Hughes Medical Institute. It is the second year of a 4 year grant. This grant

supports students and faculty, field trips, and travel for students to professional scientific conferences.

Another project of Dr. Burke's is the SEES/ California Wellness Health Professionals Project that supports students whose career goal is the health profession. It provides support for student research, travel to meetings, prep courses for professional school exams, health professional school application costs and travel to health professional school interviews.

Dr. Burke is also director of the WEEA Mentoring and Professional Project. The goal is to increase the number of women graduating in chemistry, computer science, mathematics and physics.

Finally, Dr. Burke lent her chemical experience to the History Channel for its program on "Water" in its Modern Marvels series. It will air sometime this fall.
