2. Information Items

a. Chair's Report

Chair Kumar commented that during the Leadership Retreat, there were discussions on how the Academic Senate can partner with campus administration. She looks forward to the upcoming academic year.

Chair Kumar conveyed that General Education (GE) changes will be significant this academic year. There is a GE Town Hall planned for September 12, during U-hour, in the SSB MPR. This will be an opportunity for the campus to discuss the upcoming changes to GE. Additionally, there is an event on September 5, during U-hour, in the SSB MPR, with the Ombuds from UC (University of California) Riverside. She added that the Academic

Senate played a major role in advancing the role of the University Ombuds at Cal Poly Pomona. This event will provide an opportunity to engage with an ombuds person from another university.

Another focus for the Academic Senate this year is emerging technologies. Faculty will have the opportunity to join a committee that will be looking at governance for emerging technologies. She also mentioned that the Academic Master Plan is due for an update, and the Senate will have the chance to participate in that process.

c. ASCSU (Academic Senate of the California State University) Report

Senator Wachs announced that there is a vacancy for an ASCSU Senator and encouraged faculty to apply. She added that she is still learning, but the role of the ASCSU Senator is crucial in shared governance.

She mentioned a few things to watch for: the potential merging of two CSU (California State University) campuses, upcoming GE changes, and ongoing challenges with the Board of Trustees. There have been complaints about their treatment of a former ASCSU Senate Chair. She also noted that people should keep an eye on the legislature, as it impacts what happens at the university.

d. CFA Report

Senator Puthoff reported.

Faculty across the CSU voted on and approved the new contract last academic year. One component of that contract included a five percent increase for last year, which should have appeared in paychecks around July. The other five percent increase was contingent, but it was approved. There was a lot of behind-the-scenes work by the CFA to make sure the second five percent increase was approved. The second five percent raise started in July but will not be reflected in paychecks until the next check and there will be a separate paycheck for retroactive pay from July.

Plans are in the making for an all-faculty union meeting towards the end of October. This will provide an opportunity to discuss the current state of the union.

Senator Wachs asked if the union was still looking into a 9-3-3 workload. Senator Puthoff responded that that initiative came through the Academic Senate in the 2022-23 academic year as a <u>resolution</u> which recommended a reallocation of faculty workload, and it will continue to be a priority for the CFA.
