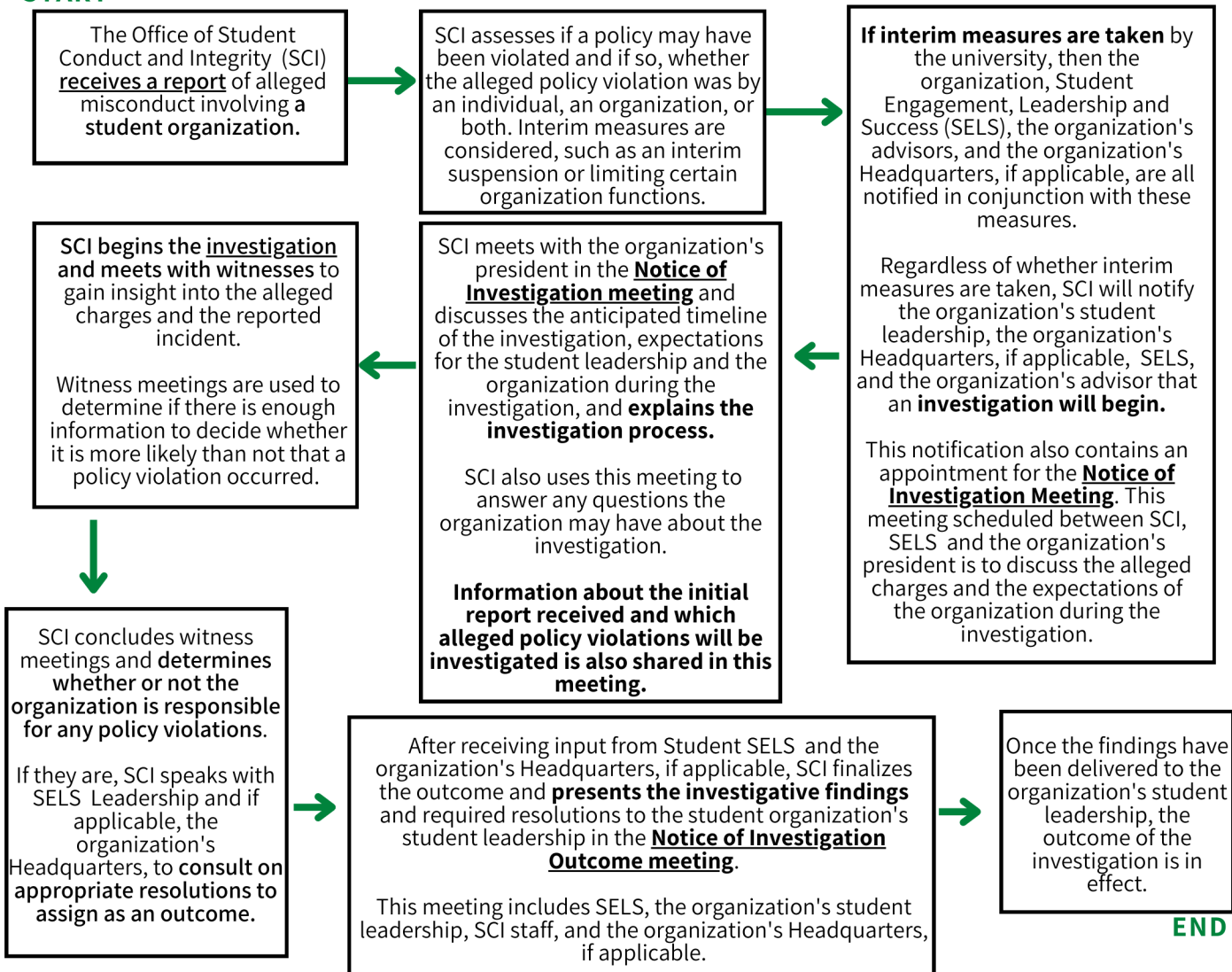




THE OFFICE OF STUDENT CONDUCT AND INTEGRITY STUDENT ORGANIZATION INVESTIGATION PROCESS

This flowchart follows the procedures of a student organization investigation as initiated by the Office of Student Conduct and Integrity at California State Polytechnic University Pomona

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: What is the standard for determining if an organization is responsible for violating a policy?

A: The Office of Student Conduct and Integrity (SCI) operates on a preponderance of the evidence, meaning the office determines whether it is more likely than not a policy violation occurred when considering if an organization is responsible for violating a policy.

Q: Is there an appeals process for student organizations?

A: Yes, there is. Once SCI has made its final decision, the organization is expected to abide by that decision. If they choose to appeal, they can notify SCI within 5 working days and information on the appeal process will be provided to the organization's President during the Notice of Investigation Outcome meeting.

Q: How will the outcome of the investigation be shared?

A: The Office of Student Conduct and Integrity may publish an organization's conduct status and their assigned resolutions on a CPP student affairs web page. Otherwise, the information is shared directly with the organization, the organization's Headquarters, if applicable, and with pertaining professional staff campus partners, if necessary.

Q: Does an organization have to participate in an investigation?

A: An organization does not have to participate in an investigation, however a lack of participation means SCI must make a decision based on the information they have without any input from the organization themselves. Students who are requested to attend witness meetings and who do not participate in the process may receive registration and transcript holds.

Q: How long does the Office of Student Conduct and Integrity maintain student organization conduct records?

A: Permanently. The Office of Student Conduct and Integrity does not remove student organization conduct records from its files.
